A Lenten Devotional How Vast a Love

When I was in elementary school my small Alaskan town built a new hospital. The building was a nice facility with large, glass, automatic doors. Shortly after the construction, a bear cub discovered the automatic doors and walked right in. The local newspaper explained the excitement and challenge of redirecting the cub away from the patients and new equipment. Stories like these are not uncommon in Alaska, where space is shared with wildlife in a way that seems unusual to most Americans. It was in this shared space – co-existing with creation – where I first learned about the depths of God and His love. For this reason, when I read Psalm 36, I cannot help but think of home.

The Psalmist speaks of God's faithfulness reaching "to the skies," and I remember the deep blue of a clear day or the nighttime radiance of the Aurora Borealis (36:5). His faithfulness is expansive. stretching as far as the eye can see and beyond. Righteousness "like the highest mountains" is captured in the hundreds of scrapping peaks all around my little town, nestled between the ocean and the Juneau Icefield (36:6a). His righteousness is strong, protective and powerful. *Justice* like the "great deeps" reminds me of fishing trips entertained by the bubble feeding of humpback whales or the playfulness of an otter or sea lion: more life exists at those depths than could ever be imagined on the surface (36:6b). His perfect justice is at work in ways that are known and unknown. Alaska is truly a land of abundance with natural resources and raging rivers still filled with sediments of gold (36:8). Out of God's abundance is his love and care for creation, for me. All of this beauty is acutely captured in the brightness of the summer sun, shining strong at midnight relieving His people from the previous months of darkness. Similarly, the light of Christ fills our hearts with refreshing vision and hope through his life, death and resurrection.

A Lenten Devotional, continued

Like many before me, I meet God in the wilderness. God's creation causes me to lift my head, exhale the distractions of this world, and breathe in His truth, his love. In imagining the seven-foot wingspan of the bald eagle, I nestle myself is His strong wings where His love is more powerful than my worry or fear. Here, I take refuge (36:7).

May your head be lifted today as you take refuge in the vastness of God's unfailing





Psalm 36:5-11

Your love, LORD, reaches to the heavens,
your faithfulness to the skies.
Your righteousness is like the highest mountains,
your justice like the great deep.
You, LORD, preserve both people and animals.
How priceless is your unfailing love, O God!
People take refuge in the shadow of your wings.
They feast on the abundance of your house;
you give them drink from your river of delights.
For with you is the fountain of life;
in your light we see light.

Continue your love to those who know you, your righteousness to the upright in heart.

May the foot of the proud not come against me, nor the hand of the wicked drive me away.
