Gospel Transformed Leadership

Throughout the autumn of 2011, the Sunday sermons were based on the letter of I Peter. This letter authored by the Apostle Peter was written to early Christians, but has great relevance to the twenty-first century church. The document begins with an exploration of the vastness of the gospel of God revealed in Jesus Christ. As the epistle moves to its second half it shifts to a form of exhortation. This exhortation commends the body of Christ to consider the ways that the Gospel changes its approach to life and life's responsibilities.

One matter this exhortation broaches is the subject of leadership in general and within the church in particular. Leadership in any organization is fundamental and in the body of Christ it is critically important. At the end of the gospel of John, Jesus charged Peter with the responsibility of leading his sheep and feeding them with the truth of his word. Correspondingly, Peter admonishes Christians to take serious the call of New Testament leadership. Typically, a minster is viewed as a leader of the church, but no church thrives based solely on the leadership of any individual. On the contrary we see that God has called many to serve in varying degrees of leadership within his community.



While the pastor and elders function in essential roles of ecclesiastical service within a church, there are many others who lead whether it is in an official role or more significantly by their lifestyles and influence.

Peter reminds the church that as it approaches, develops and establishes leaders this should be done from a Christ-centered perspective. In the present culture positions of leadership are often used to bolster one's curriculum vitae or to push forward a personal agenda. The leadership that Peter encourages in such places as I Peter 5:1-5 is leadership that is first centered in the Triune God's agenda and secondly concerned with the welfare and service of others.

Tragically, many within the contemporary church have failed to heed this call for Christ-centered leadership and the consequences have been

staggering. Peter's exhortation is one of the many New Testament texts that addresses church leadership (cf. I Timothy 3, 2 Timothy 4, Titus 2, 2 Peter 2, Jude and I Corinthians 12:1-11).

The First Baptist Church of Rockport is fortunate to have a first-class leadership team. Yet, as its ministries, fellowship and outreach expand it is important to continually seek to support those in leadership, encourage those who should be in leadership and strive to grasp the teaching behind the scriptures' exhortation to Christ-centered leadership.

Church Economic Update

The Board of Stewards will be sending out the annual Stewardship Letter in a few weeks and holding a pledge Sunday on December 4, 2011. The purpose of the letter and Pledge Sunday are to encourage church participants to think about giving goals for the end of 2011 and for 2012. Gifts can be given to the general church general budget or for the missions budget.

Thanks for your support of the church and its various efforts throughout 2011. Recently church collector Elizabeth Malcolmson provided the following encouraging information during a church Mission Moment:

As of last Sunday (10/8/11), we have collected \$73,635.06 so far this year. Last year, at the same time, we had collected \$53,905.05! That's an increase of 37%! In addition, the portfolio has also generated \$16,415.68 in income, to date, for a total of \$90,050.

On average, during the last quarter of the year, as people respond to the annual stewardship letter, we bring in 33% of the year's collection. If this were to hold true for this year, we would end with a total of \$110,000.

As we come close to the very real possibility of breaking even in 2011, please prayerfully consider how you can financially support the church throughout the end of 2011 and in 2012. Where the word was spoken: "On the ground this little dove's life will be spent."


So we took Little Dove home and gave him the shed. "Welcome to your new home; you'll always have water, food and bed."
