The Mystery of the Candles...

Every Sunday at the First Baptist Church of Rockport, there are a number of reliable occurrences that can be expected: familiar faces, preaching from the scriptures, engaging worship and scrumptious nibbles during the fellowship hour. There is another occasion that develops with routine precision every Sunday. At the beginning of each service, either John Malcolmson or Terry Schwenk carefully carries in a flame, lighting the two candles at the front of the sanctuary. At the end of the service, these faithful Acolytes also extinguish the candles, leaving the service with the flame.

For those unfamiliar with the rationale and meaning of the candle procession a justifiable question may arise. What is the point of the candle procession? The meaning behind the candles is intricately tied to the celebration of Advent that will begin on November 28, 2010.

and peace that come in Christ. During the Christmas Eve service, the Advent season culminates with the lighting of the Christ Candle (the large candle in the middle of the advent wreath). The lighting of the Christ Candle is a vivid reminder of the incarnation of God in Jesus, who is God with us. Following the lighting of the Christ Candle, the light from the candle is passed around the sanctuary as the congregation concludes in a candle lit singing of "Joy to the World! The Lord is come".

The coming of Christ in flesh is specifically remembered on Christmas and the resurrection remembered at Easter. These annual holy days are important, but the Incarnation of Christ and the Easter account deserve far more than annual patronage. Every Sunday the "Lord's Day" is to be a mini Easter and Christmas celebration. This weekly celebration should remind the Christian of his or her rightful response which should be to radiate the light of Christ in the world. It is this presupposition that lies at the base of the mystery behind the candles.

Each year the Christ Candle is moved to the Narthex and lit every Sunday. It is then from the Christ Candle that Terry or John brings in light each Sunday. This act signifies that the core message of the church is the news that the Messiah has come and it is He whom we joyously proclaim each Sunday. Likewise as the candle is carried from the sanctuary every Sunday, it is a reminder that each Christian is called to convey the light of Christ out into the world, like the Shepherds proclaiming and living out the reality that the "Lord is come, let earth receive her King". The mystery has been revealed!



Pastors and their wives Matt and Megan Wigton, Skip and Barbara Pimentel and Bob and Roberta Markham led the Ordination Celebration in song at the ceremony. Pastor Bob shepherded us for the longest term of any pastor in our history – over thirty years. Pastor Skip guided us through the choppy waters of transition after such a long ministry with one leader. And Pastor Matt represents the future of our mission and celebration at First Baptist Rockport. We are blessed!

Bible-in-Life Sunday School

As many of the congregation are aware of, the past two summers we have offered a vacation bible school week to the local youngsters (in body or mind). Beginning with the "Wildwood Forest" in 2009 and exploring the "Cosmic City" this past summer, many members of our community have enjoyed the themes we used. David C. Cook Publishing developed both of these exciting programs that we have used. Their programs are well-planned and fun for all, but most of all point to our awesome GOD.

As a parent in this church, I was excited when in September 2009 we started using David C. Cook Publishing's Bible-in-Life curriculum in our children's Sunday School. The lessons are planned according to the church calendar and focus on a particular scripture verse each quarter. Some have included:

Love one another. John 13:34

A friend loves at all times. Proverbs 17:17

Christ is the head of the Church. Ephesians 5:23

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. Hebrews 13:8

[Jesus said,] "Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father." John 14:9

While this adventure of teaching Sunday School has been new to some involved, the Bible-in-Life curriculum we are using is a great tool to encourage and guide both the teacher and the student. There are different age variations of the lessons available. We started off using the program aimed at preschool ages, and soon decided to switch to the early elementary aimed program. This Bible-in-Life curriculum has the ability to grow with our church as our next generation grows in Christ Jesus. Our classes are small now, but are ready to grow. With seven different age based variations, from toddler through high school, only God can limit the number of souls we can reach. But, from our VBS experiences I would dare say that God IS LIMITLESS!! So, let's not limit God! Let's do all that we can to support, pray for, and contribute to everybody learning of Jesus' love. Then we will have no limits.
